Letter to save cheetahs-leader's notes

Background to activity

Children will have to write a letter to a fictional South African farmer using reason and persuasion to ask them to stop killing cheetahs.

Materials needed

- Pens and paper
- ICT and internet facilities

Running the activity

Research online the issue of human-cheetah conflict (http://www.savingcatsanddogs.org/stories/cheetahs-and-guard-dogs/). Ask children to list the reasons why cheetahs are killed and think of solution to each issue. Then get the children to write a formal letter to a fictional farmer with the purpose of saving cheetahs lives.

Extension activities
