Christmas activities – leader's notes

Background to activity

During these fun activities children will also learn about stag beetle ecology and habitats. These are simple ideas for you to elaborate on as you wish.

- **Stag beetle Yule Logs** create chocolate logs with a twist! A cooking activity to create an edible log pile and stag beetles or even marshmallow larvae.
