Reasons to be cheerful, Pt. 3



Following in the spirit of a former Tring resident, why should orchards give us reasons to be cheerful? With Climate Change looming, Nature's 'Ecosystem Services'* are increasingly recognised as the planet's life-support. Orchards can help by contributing to:

Air: Vegetation filters pollutants; Pollination: Blossom supports pollinators; Pest control: Habitat for wasps, birds and hedgehogs; Soils: Natural soils support nutrient-recycling biota; Water: Regulate water

quality by reducing soil erosion; Carbon: Trees and soils store carbon and leaves emit oxygen; Climate: Regulate local temperature, humidity and water; Flooding: Trees slow run -off and draw water up; Health and Well-Being: Can affect immune systems, allergies and spirituality; Food: Fruit provides fresh, local, seasonal produce; Biodiversity: Distinctive wildlife including lichens, beetles and moths; Culture: Enriching landscapes to relax and celebrate, Wassail!

That's twelve reasons to be cheerful! However, Orchards East has shown a regional decline in farmhouse orchards of over 80% since 1900**. We need to conserve, support and celebrate the special orchards we have left - and plant lots more! Whilst Ian Dury suggested a few more reasons, DON'T just get back into bed - come along and see what the 2022 Apple Fayre has to offer to promote a more sustainable future!


